### **Sports News**

**Marathon Challenge** - Our marathon challenge is now complete. Lots of our pupils have completed a full marathon, or more. Now the laps have been counted and verified, the medals will be on their way soon.

**Sports Day** - Sports Day starts at 1.30 p.m. on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. Everyone is welcome as long as they smile and cheer loudly! It is a very exciting afternoon for the children and we dread the thought of it raining. If we have to cancel we will send a text in the morning and then attempt to run the event on the next available dry afternoon.

Pupils will need a water bottle and can wear a red, yellow, green or blue T-shirt to help distinguish their team colour. It would be wise to send your child to school with a hat and sunscreen. We recommend spectators bringing their own seats or picnic rugs.

N.B. At the end of the afternoon we like all pupils to come back into classrooms with their teachers and then they can be collected as usual at 3.30 p.m.

**Swimming lessons** - Pupils from Year 2 - 6 are having their swimming lessons this term at Ingleton Pool. Wharfedale and Swaledale on Mondays, and Wensleydale and Barbondale on Thursdays. They will be taught by school staff along with swimming teacher Ms Townsend. Children will require their swimwear (no bikinis please) and towels every week. Please ensure that your child has warm clothes for walking to and from the pool. They may also want to bring a drink of water and some fruit or bread. Please email us or ring if your child will not be swimming for any reason.

Please talk to class teachers if you can assist with walking to/from the pool.

**PE** - John Hughes from Cumbria Cricket is back again this term to teach cricket sessions, this term for Barbondale and Wensleydale. He also does a lunchtime cricket club for key stage 2 pupils. Mrs Mercer is with Kingsdale and Dentedale this term doing outdoor PE and a badminton lunchtime club for KS2.

**Swimming Gala** - Monday 18<sup>th</sup> July is the date for our Swimming Gala for pupils in years 3-6. Parents/carers are invited to come down to the pool to watch this event from 9.30am.

**Y6 Rounders Match** - As a celebration of their time at Ingleton Primary School, parents are invited to join us for a Parents v Pupils rounders match on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> July at 1:30pm followed by refreshments.

### **Educational Visits**

Teachers organise visits to enhance learning opportunities and create memorable days so we appreciate our hardworking staff who provide such wonderful experiences. Children who have school dinners can have a packed lunch provided by school but this needs to be prearranged and, if necessary, paid for through the office. We request voluntary financial contributions for most trips since we are unable to pay from our limited school funds. Costs are shared between pupils and travel is often subsidised by P.T.A. In the case of sporting/adventurous activities, money is allocated from the Sports Premium. If we don't generate enough funding we may need to cancel trips. If anyone has concerns about paying for visits please talk to Mrs Colledge.

### **Class Organisation**

In September we will have 160 pupils to be taught in six classes (excluding Nursery) i.e. an average class size of 27. We will have three single age classes for Reception, Y5 and Y6. The other three classes will contain two year groups – Y1/2, Y2/3 and Y3/4.

When we are making decisions about which children should be allocated to which class a number of influences are taken into consideration to make a professional judgement. These include (and are in no order of preference): gender and age (balance of class and year group), additional needs, maturity, ability and friendship groups. These factors are taken into consideration by the Headteacher, Senior Leadership Team and Class Teachers. However, it is the Headteacher who makes the final allocation based on their professional judgement of where a child will best flourish in their personal, social, moral and academic achievements. You will be notified of children's classes and which staff will be teaching each class as soon as details are finalised.

### **Child Protection**

## OUR INGLEBOROUGH FESTIVAL PRESS RELEASE



The ‘Our Ingleborough’ Festival is a four-day travelling exhibition which explores the past, present and future of land use around Ingleborough. Over the past six months, the ‘Our Ingleborough’ project has been documenting memories of the past, connections to the land and visions for the future of this landscape from artists, residents, visitors and school children.

Wild Ingleborough is an ambitious, landscape-scale project working with the community to bring about nature’s recovery in North Yorkshire. As part of this nature recovery project, people who live, work and visit the Ingleborough area star in a short film and podcast series, and others took part a number of workshops to gather a variety of creative responses to share their perspective on this area of the Dales. For four days, the results of this work will be shown in community spaces, alongside the work of local artists and children, in Ingleton, Ribbleshead, Settle and Clapham from the 16th – 19th June.

Artist, filmmaker and ‘Our Ingleborough’ lead, Matthew Somerville, said: “Land use is a huge issue for our future. Considering changing ecosystems, additional pressures on food production and increased tourism, the way in which we manage the environment feels more important than ever. Through

working on this project, I witnessed a common theme among people who sometimes disagree; the most important thing is that we begin to work together on securing a healthy relationship with the natural world.”

Our Ingleborough comprised a series of creative workshops with Settle and Ingleton Primary Schools, commissioning five students to produce artwork about the future of Ingleborough and hosting a series of intergenerational conversations between students and their grandparents. In addition, a short film, podcast series with oral historian Anna Greenwood in collaboration with Voices from the Dales and a 360/ VR video installation enable us to hear from a diverse range of voices, including a cave rescue volunteer, fell runner, farmers, and hiking groups. This initiative has engaged over 200 people in the local community. Funded art projects featured by five primary school children, printmaker Hester Cox ([www.hestercox.com](http://www.hestercox.com)), fine artist Pip Seymour ([www.wallaceseymour.co.uk](http://www.wallaceseymour.co.uk)) and painter Susan Parker ([www.farsunnybank.weebly.com](http://www.farsunnybank.weebly.com)).

Wild Ingleborough lead, Jono Leadley, said: “As part of nature’s recovery, it’s vital that we listen to the voices of local people and their visions for future. This programme of work highlights the importance of Ingleborough for people, nature and livelihoods and the complex demands placed on our natural environment”.
