## **Information for Parents**

Teachers will continue to send their 'Friday Round-Up' emails this year. They will pass on all the information you need as parents and will set out class routines and expectations for the year ahead. Class teachers will be out on the playground at the end of the day so you can informally introduce yourselves and 'break the ice' if you haven't met them already.

Alternatively, on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September after school, staff will be available for informal 'drop in' sessions if you would like to come along and meet them, have a chat and find out how your child is settling in. Teachers will be sending more information in their Friday emails.

Early in Spring we will have Parents' Evenings. Please remember that teachers are always willing to discuss any concerns with you at other times during the year if you arrange a mutually convenient time. Likewise, teachers may also contact you to arrange a meeting if they want to discuss your child's

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progress at any time during the year. Emailing makes communication quick and easy, but please respect teacher's evenings and weekends – they will get back to you at their convenience.

#### Uniform - please name all uniform and PE kit

We are proud of our very smart children at Ingleton and we believe that pupils should take pride in their appearance as well as their work. However, please remind them that trainers are for outdoor PE only (they do forget!) and we appreciate sensible shoes. Pupils require wellies and suitable outdoor clothing daily – we like to have fresh air and exercise in all weathers.

Jewellery should not be brought to school. Earrings must be either removed or taped over on PE days to avoid any accidents. Long hair needs to be tied back please.

Our **P.E. kit** comprises of a <u>white</u> t-shirt, black/navy shorts, plain, dark coloured tracksuit top and bottoms, as well as trainers for indoors. Dance and gym are often barefoot indoors so no need for pumps. It is essential that children have PE kit in school every day. Thank you.

We have been given quite a lot of second-hand uniform in good condition. This is free to a good home and will be on a table on the bottom playground after school on Wednesday, tomorrow.

#### **Dinnertime**

We sent out the autumn term menu last week with our new meal choices. Please have a look through our menu and help your child make some food choices in advance. We like children to try a varied diet and encourage them to try the meals on offer so that children aren't just opting for a panini every day. We can adapt some meals so the children really enjoy their lunch.

If you have any special dietary requirements, please contact Mrs Dixon.

We always like to keep our school dinner numbers as high as possible, but realise the price increase this term may be difficult for some families. If you decide you would like your child to have a hot main meal in school during the winter months, then a lighter tea at home – save putting the oven on - please let us know nearer the time. Thank you.
